It only takes one person to make a difference. Will it be you?

High school seniors who are at least 17 years of age and registered to vote may be excused from school for one day to allow them to serve as poll workers. Why should you sign up?

It's easy. Just contact your local Board of Elections and tell them you are interested. Most boards require only a few hours of training beforehand and then you are good to go.



Get school credit. Talk to your social studies teacher about using your experience as a poll worker as extra credit.

Give back. Becoming a poll worker will help make elections run smoother and show adults that young people do make a difference.
