Dear Mr. Harrison,

As organizations dedicated to promoting free speech, including freedom of the press and artistic expression, we are deeply alarmed by the seizure of equipment from a professional photographer in Detroit by DHS officers (Case # 2019380700131101). The iPhone, camera and laptop of Tim Stegmaier of Cincinnati, Ohio, were confiscated under Title 18 U.S. Code § 2254 (civil forfeiture: property used or intended to be used to commit or promote the commission of an offense involving any visual depiction of sexual exploitation of children). Since we believe the seizure of this equipment was made in error, we urge DHS to expedite its investigation while taking into account Stegmaier's profession as a documentary photographer, and to release his property with its full contents intact as soon as possible.

Stegmaier is a professional photographer whose published work falls within the conventions of documentary photography. He has traveled to China, the Philippines, Vietnam, Cambodia, Guinea, and Senegal to take photographs of people living in extreme conditions. His photographs are intended to increase awareness of the lives of people in the developing world. His subjects, typical to the genre, include people going about their daily routines, such as children walking in the neighborhood or swimming without clothes on. The presence of naked children in public spaces is the norm in many developing countries and such images have appeared in many popular travel and culture magazines, where Stegmaier's work has also been published.

Images of naked children taken in public for the purpose of documenting their lives do not, without more substantial evidence, constitute sexual exploitation under Title 18. Furthermore, hindering a photographer from taking or using such an image is counterproductive to "protecting" children and actually hampers the work of advancing the rights of children. Indeed, were section 2254 to be interpreted in such an expansive and constitutionally suspect manner, Nick Ut's iconic and Pulitzer Prize-winning photographs of "Napalm Girl" (see: https://tinyurl.com/nqqb7za), which helped change the public's attitude about the Vietnam War, may be subject to seizure and suppression.

The undersigned, as advocates who fight against censorship and work to defend First Amendment protections for journalists, artists and other content creators, are deeply concerned by DHS' treatment of Mr. Stegmaier. The possible disregard by DHS of federal and state level constitutional protections granted to Mr. Steigmaier strike at the heart of the most vital rights
