REDISTRICTING EDITION



TESTIFIED

On September 12, **Deputy Policy Director** Collin Marozzi testified on the proposed map's failure to take into account the Voting Rights Act, and its failure to comply with Section 6 requirements.

SIGNED

On November 20, Governor DeWine signed Senate Bill 258 into law, which establishes new congressional districts for Ohio, giving Republicans an unconstitutional partisan advantage.

TESTIFIED

The Ohio Redistricting **Commission convened** in August 2021 to begin work on the new legislative districts. **Our Deputy Policy Director Collin Marozzi** testified in support of #FairMaps.

FILED

On November 30, the ACLU of Ohio filed a lawsuit challenging in the Ohio Supreme Court, challenging the gerrymandered map that awards Republicans 67-80% of Ohio's congressional seats, although the party receives only 55% of Ohioans' votes.



On **September 16**, the Ohio Redistricting Commission, in voting 5-2 along strictly party lines, violated Ohio's Constitution and adopted a gerrymandered map, designed to entrench a Republican veto-proof supermajority in both chambers of the General Assembly.

STRUCK DOWN

On January 14, the Ohio Supreme Court struck down the congressional map as an unconstitutional partisan gerrymander. Ohio lawmakers couldn't complete the task, so the redrawing duty fell to the **Ohio Redistricting Commission,** which enacted a second unconstitutional map on March 2.

Ohio filed a lawsuit in the Ohio Supreme Court, challenging the map, which would give an extreme and unfair advantage to the Republican Party.

FILED (AGAIN)

On March 22, the ACLU of Ohio filed a new lawsuit challenging Ohio's congressional map, requesting that the constitutional deficiencies of the map be remedied in time for the 2024 election cycle. The fight continues!

STRUCK DOWN

On January 12, after months of briefings — and oral arguments in December — the Ohio Supreme Court struck down the legislative map as an unconstitutional partisan gerrymander and rdered the Commission to back to the drawing board.



INTERVENED

On May 28, after five attempts, five court rejections, and five challenges from the ACLU of Ohio, a federal court intervened in the legislative redistricting process and ordered the Secretary of State to implement a map for the 2022 election cycle that was *already rejected* by the Ohio Supreme Court. Our fight for fair General Assembly District Maps continues for 2024 and beyond. The second primary (for statehouse races only) will be held on August 2.








THE MARATHON CONTINUES

After nearly nine full months of the ACLU of Ohio challenging and re-challenging gerrymandered maps, the legislative and congressional redistricting process — for the 2022 election cycle — has come to a dramatic end. This has been an arduous and frustrating journey, but the fight is not yet over. We are still actively litigating before the Ohio Supreme Court to ensure that we have fair, constitutional plans in place for 2024 and beyond, for both the state legislative and U.S. Congressional maps.

- Are the maps perfect? **No.**
- Was the Ohio redistricting process flawed? **Of course.**
- Are the maps significantly improved as a result of our lawsuits, tenacity, and persistence? **Absolutely, unequivocally, emphatically yes.** Ohio is much better off today, than when this effort began last summer, in large part because of our strategic and methodical challenges to the gerrymandered maps.



Despite our multiple court victories, the momentum on our side, and the passion, dedication, and determination from Ohio voters to finally achieve the fair maps they demanded, the process was flawed and the outcome soiled. It is incredibly disappointing to see honor, civility, and decorum abandoned in favor of short-sighted, self-serving political gamesmanship.

The Republicans on the Ohio Redistricting Commission abandoned their constitutional responsibility and reverted to an ugly and familiar display of hyperpartisanship. The majority commissioners chose secrecy over transparency, ignored constitutionally mandated deadlines, and showed utter disdain for the expectations of the Ohio electorate and for the law every step of the way.

We the people deserved so much better. Together, we will work through our collective anger to slay the gerrymandering beast once and for all. The stakes for the future of our great state could not be higher.

It takes hard work to be a champion of democracy, a preserver of rights and liberties, and a visionary for a more perfect Ohio, and we are ready for the battles ahead.
