ACLU OF OHIO POSITION

The ACLU firmly opposes the SAVE Act as it would disenfranchise millions of eligible voters through unnecessary, restrictive documentary proof-of-citizenship requirements for voter registration.

Voting is the cornerstone of our democracy.

The ACLU of Ohio played a pivotal role in the 2023 campaign to secure passage of The Ohio Reproductive Freedom Amendment.

Every person should have the freedom and power to make deeply personal decisions about their body and future, free from government interference.

The ACLU opposes additional funding for ICE and calls for safeguards against racial profiling, detention of children, and warrantless arrests.

Regardless of immigration status, everyone has basic rights that are protected by the U.S. Constitution.

The ACLU of Ohio recognizes a safer Ohio means investing beyond policing in our communities regardless of one's past with the criminal legal system.

For far too long, we've imagined and funded public safety as having solutions only in policing.
