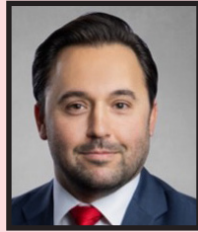
Landsman opposes the federal SAVE Act.

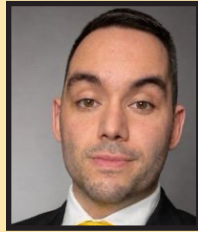
Conroy supports the federal SAVE Act.
