

DECLARATION OF MOLLY M. RUGG
(pursuant to 28 U.S.C. Section 1776)

My name is Molly M. Rugg and I am over the age of 18 and fully competent to make this declaration. Under penalty of perjury, I declare the following:

1. I am a paralegal for the American Civil Liberties Union Foundation's Voting Rights Project.
2. Attached to this declaration are screenshots of certain websites concerning the early voting (absentee in-person voting) hours offered by certain counties in Ohio in general elections prior to 2012.
3. To find this information, I first searched Google for the early voting hours of a particular county during a particular year. I took screenshots of any webpages I found that contained that information.
4. In cases where I was not able to find the information through Google, I used a webpage archive called the WayBack Machine, located at <https://archive.org/web/>. According to the website, the archive is run by a nonprofit organization whose goal is to create a library of internet pages that might otherwise disappear or change with time.
5. The WayBack Machine pulled up old versions of county Board of Elections websites. Some county websites displayed early voting information for a particular general election in the months leading up to that election, but removed that information after the election. I used the WayBack Machine to attempt to find the website as it existed during that time window.
6. If I could not find a county's past early voting hours through Google, I searched for the website address for the county Board of Elections. I then visited the WayBack


Machine's search page, <https://archive.org/web/>. I pasted the address for the county Board of Elections website into the "Browse History" bar and clicked "Browse History."

7. From there, the WayBack Machine brought me to a calendar page that displayed the twelve months of the present year, with blue circles indicating dates on which the Machine had taken a snapshot of the webpage for the archives. Across the top of the calendar page was a bar displaying all years from 1996 to the present. Upon clicking on any of these years, a new twelve-month calendar appeared showing blue circles for the dates on which the Machine took a snapshot of that particular webpage during that year.
8. I clicked on the relevant year (e.g., 2010) and then selected a snapshot from a day during the months leading up to the November election (or, in some cases, shortly after the election). Some of the counties' websites displayed their early voting hours on the homepage, while others required me to click through to their absentee information pages, voter information pages, or frequently asked questions pages. When I did locate the early voting hours, I took a screenshot on my computer. All screenshots from this site contain the date of the webpage version in the top-right.
9. The screenshots attached to this declaration were pulled using the methods described above.
10. The screenshots include my computer's taskbar. The time and date located at the bottom-right corner on the taskbar indicates the date and time that I took the screenshot (i.e., the date and time that I visited the website).
11. According to the attached screenshots, the following counties had multiple Sundays available for early in-person voting in 2008 and/or 2010: Cuyahoga, Franklin, Hamilton, Summit, Lucas, and Montgomery.

12. According to the attached screenshots, Cuyahoga County had five Sundays available for early in-person voting in 2008, Franklin County had five Sundays available for early in-person voting in 2008, and Summit County had five Sundays available for early in-person voting in both 2008 and 2010.
13. According to the attached screenshots, the following counties had three to five Saturdays available for early in-person voting in 2008 and/or 2010: Cuyahoga, Franklin, Hamilton, Summit, Greene, and Butler.

I declare under penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true and correct.

Notice to Election Day Voters

(Identification Requirements for the November 2008 Election)

Voters must bring identification to the polls in order to verify identity. Identification may include current and valid photo identification, a military identification, or a copy of a current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck, or other government document, other than this reminder or a voter registration notification, that shows the voter's name and current address. Voters who do not provide one of these documents will still be able to vote by providing the last four digits of the voter's social security number and by casting a provisional ballot. Voters who do not have any of the above forms of identification, including a social security number, will still be able to vote by signing an affirmation

LUCAS COUNTY (WTOL) - We're over two months away from the November election, but early voting starts September 30.

In order to avoid long lines, Lucas County is moving its early voting location from Government Center to the larger EMS Training Center at 2127 Jefferson St.

"People will still be able to register to vote and vote absentee at the same time, so we're going to start with paper ballot only the first 5 days. Then after that, we hope we'll be ready to vote on machine," says Linda Howe.

Early voting eliminated on Sundays across Ohio

Ohio voters this year will not be able to cast votes at boards of elections on Sundays – and that has some Democrats angered across the state.

Voters will still be able to cast ballots weekdays and two Saturdays in the four weeks before Election Day under a directive issued Tuesday by Republican Secretary of State Jon Husted. They'll also be able to cast early ballots by mail.

But to Hamilton County Board of Elections Chairman Tim Burke, who is also the county's Democratic Party chairman, Sunday voting is "critical."

"On the Sunday before the 2012 election, our board of elections was virtually surrounded by people waiting for three and more hours to vote," he said. "It was a clear demonstration of why preserving Sunday hours, especially in our large urban counties, is critical."

Board of elections records show 24,151 people voted early and in-person in the 2012 general election. Of those, 1,142 cast ballots on the Sunday before early voting – or 4.7 percent of all early votes that year.

Overall, though, Sunday voters amounted to 0.27 percent of Hamilton County voters that year.

Early voting was permitted on two Sundays in 2010, with 296 Hamilton County voters taking advantage of the weekend day.

The Hamilton County Board of Elections makes voting convenient for Hamilton County residents. Prior to Election Day, voters can participate in absentee voting. Early voting (also known “as in-person absentee voting”) began September 28 and continues through Monday, November 1. Voters may choose to vote early by absentee ballot through the mail. And, of course, the polls will be open on Election Day — Tuesday, November 2, 2010.

Voter Registration Deadline

Monday, October 4, 2010 is the registration deadline for purposes of voting in this November’s election. The Board of Elections offers extended hours on October 4 to provide extra time for citizens to register: 8 a.m.—9 p.m.

Absentee Ballot by Mail

Voters may vote early by absentee ballot through the mail. Please visit www.votehamiltoncounty.org to download an application for absentee ballot. Voters may also get applications at the Board of Elections office.

Absentee ballot applications may be dropped off at the Board of Elections until noon on Saturday, October 30, 2010. Ballots returned by mail to the Board of Elections must be postmarked no later than November 1, 2010 and must be received by the Board no later than 10 days after Election Day.

She says, "We mailed out cards to every registered voter, telling them the name of their new precinct and where they vote and attached to that was an absentee ballot request card that if they decide they want to vote by mail they can send it out and mail that in."

If you didn't receive your card in the mail, you're encouraged to call the board of elections.

In-person absentee voting (early voting) will take place at 1302 Washington St., at the corner of 13th and Washington streets.

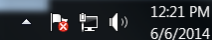
