Issued Pursuant to Court Order DIRECTIVE 2014-17

June 17, 2014

To: All County Boards of Elections

Directors, Deputy Directors, and Board Members

Re: Uniform Days and Hours for In-Person Absentee Voting

BACKGROUND

On June 11, 2014, a Federal District Court declared R.C. 3509.03 to be unconstitutional and permanently enjoined the Secretary of State from enforcing it to the extent that it relates to the 6:00 p.m. deadline for in-person absentee voting, which was enacted by the General Assembly in 2011. In addition, the Court ordered the Secretary of State to "set uniform and suitable hours for in-person early voting hours for all eligible voters for the three days preceding all future elections."

INSTRUCTIONS

All boards of elections are instructed to adopt the following as their business hours for in-person absentee voting:

A. Presidential General Elections²

- Weeks One and Two of Voting (beginning with the day after the close of registration for the election, except any holiday established by state law⁴)
 - o 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on each weekday (Monday through Friday)
- Week Three of Voting
 - o 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. on each weekday (Monday through Friday)
 - o 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. on Saturday
- Week Four of Voting
 - o 8:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. on each weekday (Monday through Friday)
 - o 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. on the Saturday before the election⁵
 - o 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. on the Sunday before the election⁵
- Week of Election Day
 - o 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. on the Monday before the election⁵

B. Presidential Primary Elections⁶ and Gubernatorial General Elections⁷

- Weeks One and Two of Voting (beginning with the day after the close of registration for the election, except any holiday established by state law⁴)
 - o 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on each weekday (Monday through Friday)

- Week Three of Voting
 - o 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on each weekday (Monday through Friday)
 - o 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. on Saturday
- Week Four of Voting
 - o 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on each weekday (Monday through Friday)
 - o 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. on the Saturday before the election⁵
 - o 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. on the Sunday before the election⁵
- Week of Election Day
 - o 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. on the Monday before the election⁵

C. Regular Municipal Elections, Primary Elections, and Special Elections 10

- Weeks One, Two and Three of Voting (beginning with the day after the close of registration for the election, except any holiday established by state law⁴)
 - o 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on each weekday (Monday through Friday)
- Week Four of Voting
 - o 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on each weekday (Monday through Friday)
 - o 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. on the Saturday before the election⁵
 - o 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. on the Sunday before the election⁵
- Week of Election Day
 - o 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. on the Monday before the election⁵

Any voters in line at the end of these regular business hours must be permitted to make their application and vote.¹¹
