An Unnecessary, Strict Photo ID Mandate for Ohio Voters

What the Bill Does:

- Eliminates Ohio's current voter ID framework, which has proven to provide the appropriate balance between security and accessibility
- Mandates Ohio voters use a state-issued photo ID to vote
- Requires Ohio voters to show either an Ohio driver's license, or state ID card when voting in-person on Election Day, early in-person, or by mail
- Requires a voter's photo ID to contain the voter's current address, as shown on the voter's voter registration record
- · Requires Ohio to spend millions of taxpayers dollars to provide free IDs
